1	This table should be provided for each reporting period i.e. when there are changes in the leverage ratio exceeding 15%
2	<p><i>Material periodic changes in the leverage ratio:</i></p> <p>Banks are required to explain the key drivers of material changes in the their Basel III leverage ratio observed from the end of previous reporting period to the end of the curent reporting period (whether these changes stem from changes in the numerator and / or from changes in the denominator).</p>
3	<p>The Basel III leverage ratio is defined as the capital measure (the numerator) divided by the exposure measure (the denominator), with this ratio expressed as a percentage:</p> $\text{Leverage Ratio} = \frac{\text{Capital measure}}{\text{Exposure measure}}$
4	An anlysis will need to be carried out both for the numerator (Tier-I Capital) and exposure measure (denominator).
